5. approved investment and financial reports as presented;
6. approved appropriation modifications;
7. approved a transfer of funds from the general fund to the athletic fund;
8. employed Amy Wolff at MA, Step 10 beginning December 10, 2009, and prorated for the remainder of her long-term substitute assignment;
9. employed individuals in supplemental salary positions for the 2009-2010 school year;
